Marley New Zealand Ltd, RX Plastics Ltd and Dynex Extrusions Ltd are part of the Aliaxis group, a privately owned business based in Belgium and active around the world. The NZ organisation is committed to collecting, maintaining, and using personal information about our clients and business contacts responsibly. This Cookie Notice describes the cookies that are used on our website portfolio (including but not limited to marley.co.nz, rxp.co.nz, dynex.co.nz, dux.co.nz, palliside.co.nz and all sub-sites, together referred to as the "Website") and the personal information that may be collected through these cookies. This Cookie Notice will be considered together with our Privacy Notice.

1. Cookies

To make our Website simpler to use and navigate, we sometimes place small data files on your computer or device. These are known as cookies.

A cookie is a small text file that a website saves on your computer or mobile device when you visit the site. It enables the website to remember your actions and preferences (such as login, language, font size and other display preferences) over a period of time, so you don't have to keep re-entering them whenever you come back to the site or browse from one page to another.

Most websites you visit will use cookies in order to improve your user experience by enabling that website to 'remember' you, either for the duration of your visit (using a 'session cookie') or for repeat visits (using a 'persistent cookie').

Cookies do lots of different jobs, like letting you navigate between pages efficiently, storing your preferences, and generally improving your experience of a website. Cookies make the interaction between you and the website faster and easier. If a website doesn't use cookies, it will think you are a new visitor every time you move to a new page on the site – for example, when you enter your login details and move to another page it won't recognise you and it won't be able to keep you logged in.

We use cookies to make the Website work better for you and because they are essential to the usage of our Website. You can control and/or delete cookies as you wish – for details, see www.aboutcookies.org.

You can delete all cookies that are already on your computer and you can set most browsers to prevent them from being placed. If you do this, however, you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit our Website and some services and functionalities may be inaccessible or not work properly.

2. How we use cookies

Our Website uses several cookies. We have listed each of them below with more details about why we use them.

Type of cookie	Purpose	Expiry	How to block
Essential website cookie (i.e. session cookie)	Session cookies are cookies that last for a session. A session starts when you launch a website or web app and ends when you leave the website or close your browser window. Session cookies contain information that is stored in a temporary memory location which is deleted after the session ends.	Session cookies only last as long as your browser is open and are automatically deleted when a user closes the browser.	Sessions cookies cannot be blocked. These are necessary for the website functioning.
Functionality and performance cookie	These cookies are used to enhance the performance and functionality for a website. An excellent example of a functional cookie is a cookie that remembers user location, chosen language or other settings to provide a personalised user experience on a website. Other examples of functional cookies include chat services and user preferences.	The cookie expiration or cookie duration is either set by the website publisher or domains that drop the cookies. We can not set cookie expiration. e.g, see the below site. The "functional Cookie" duration is set by Cloud Flare app to 30 minutes.	These cookies can be blocked from the browser. You can find instructions on how to block the cookie here.
Analytics cookie (i.e. Google analytics)	Used to collect information about how visitors use our Website. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the Website. These cookies collect information that is used either in aggregate form to help us understand how our Websites are being used or how effective are marketing campaigns are, or to help us customise our Websites for you.	The cookie expiration or cookie duration is either set by the website publisher or domains that drop the cookies.	You can find further information about Google Analytics cookies (including how to opt-out) here. You can also change your browser settings to accept or refuse these cookies. You can find instructions on how to block the cookie here.
Advertising cookies	These cookies are used to make advertising messages more relevant to you. They perform functions like preventing the same ad from continuously reappearing, ensuring that ads are properly displayed for advertisers, and in some cases selecting advertisements that are based on your interests.	The cookie expiration or cookie duration is either set by the website publisher or domains that drop the cookies.	You may change your browser settings to accept or refuse these cookies. You can find instructions on how to block the cookie here.

Type of cookie	Purpose	Expiry	How to block
Social media cookies	These cookies are used to enable you to share pages and content that you find interesting on our Websites through third party social networking and other websites. These cookies may also be used for advertising purposes too.	The cookie expiration or cookie duration is either set by the website publisher or domains that drop the cookies.	You may change your browser settings to accept or refuse these cookies. You can find instructions on how to block the cookie here.
